

Box Ladies

Renee Zarate from Bolton, Massachusetts, used Dina Wakley's new cling mount stamps (see A Touch of Inspiration on page 16) to create these unique party favor boxes. She took a small box template and stretched her creative muscle by using different materials for each — for example, she filled the boxes with raffia ribbon, patterned tissue paper, and even a used dryer sheet! The possibilities for these beautiful boxes seem truly endless and would surely be a hit at any party.

Lonely Girl • 7½" tall

Die-cut box template, fold, and adhere. Adhere Styrofoam to inside of box. Adhere patterned tissue paper to inside of box. Heat-emboss image of woman onto book page, cut out, adhere to toothpick, and adhere to box. Wrap ribbon around box, and adhere. Adhere tissue flower and button to box. Apply acrylic paint randomly to box.

Supplies Stamps: (Stampington & Company — Dina Wakley). Accents: die (Cricut)



Lonely Girl Raffia • 7½" tall

Die-cut box template, fold, and adhere. Adhere Styrofoam to inside of box. Adhere raffia to inside of box. Heat-emboss image of girl, cut out, adhere to toothpick, and adhere to box. Wrap patterned tissue strips around box, and adhere. Adhere tissue flower and button to box.

Supplies Stamps: (Stampington & Company — Dina Wakley). Accents: die (Cricut)



Grungy Silhouette • 7½" tall

Stamp writing onto patterned cardstock, die-cut box template, fold, and adhere. Adhere Styrofoam to inside of box. Ink and stamp used dryer sheet and adhere to inside of box. Heat-emboss image of woman, cut out, adhere to toothpick, and adhere to box. Cut out flowers from book page, layer and attach with brad, and adhere to back of woman's head. Apply acrylic paint randomly to box.
